### Advancement Basics

#### ScoutBook Software

Troop 250G uses Scoutbook for tracking and logging scout rank and advancements. You will receive an email inviting the parent to join our troop Scoutbook, then you add your scout.

#### Service Hours

There is a requirement to earn service hours for each rank. There are many opportunities offered by the Troop to earn the hours. You may also find your own opportunity to earn hours, which must be first approved by the Scoutmaster, Mrs. Carolyn Minnich. The Service Hours Completion Form can be found on the Troop 250 website. Completed forms are turned in to Mrs. Elmarie Klapheke to be credited to your Scoutbook Service Record.

If you help with a Troop service project or an Eagle project, please be sure to sign in when you arrive and leave so you receive credit for attending.

#### Position of Responsibility

The Star, Life, and Eagle ranks each have a Position of Responsibility requirement. Speak with the current Senior Patrol Leader, [T250GSPL@gmail.com](mailto:T250GSPL@gmail.com) to determine the best position for you to help the Troop and fulfill your requirement.

#### Scoutmaster Conference

After completing the requirements for your rank, schedule a Scoutmaster Conference by contacting Mrs. Carolyn Minnich at [T250Gscoutmaster@gmail.com](mailto:T250Gscoutmaster@gmail.com). When you attend your Scoutmaster Conference, be in full uniform and have a parent/guardian attend with you. Be sure to download and complete the scoutmaster request forms on the website.

#### Board of Review

After successfully completing your Scoutmaster Conference, schedule a Board of Review by contacting Mrs. Elmarie Klapheke at [T250Gadvancements@gmail.com](mailto:T250Gadvancements@gmail.com). When you attend your Board of Review, be in full uniform and bring materials to demonstrate your skills.

#### Court of Honor

After passing a Board of Review, you can immediately start working on your next rank. You will receive your rank badge and be officially recognized at the next Court of Honor.

#### Communications

It is the Scout's responsibility to communicate in person or via email regarding their advancement progress (requesting merit badges, Scoutmaster Conference, Board of Review, etc.). **\*\*\*Please be sure that any emails include your first and last name and that parents are copied on the email.\*\*\***

### Beyond First Class Scout Rank Requirements

#### Star Rank Requirements

1. Active First Class Scout for at least 4 months.
2. Demonstrate Scout spirit by living the Scout Oath and Scout Law in your everyday life.
3. Earn 6 Merit Badges ~ 4 must be from Eagle required list.
4. While a First Class Scout, take part in service projects totaling at least 6 hours of work.
5. While a First Class Scout, serve your Troop for 4+ months in a position of responsibility.
6. With your parent or guardian complete exercises in "How to Protect Your Children from Child Abuse: A Parent's Guide" and earn Cyber Chip award for your grade.
7. Scoutmaster Conference
8. Board of Review

#### Life Rank Requirements

1. Active Star Scout for at least 6 months.
2. Demonstrate Scout spirit by living the Scout Oath and Scout Law in your everyday life.
3. Earn 5 more Merit Badges ~ 3 must be from Eagle required list.
4. While a Star Scout, take part in service projects totaling at least 6 hours of work. At least 3 hours must be conservation related.
5. While a Star Scout, serve your Troop for 6+ months in a position of responsibility.
6. While a Star Scout, use the EDGE method to teach another Scout.
7. Scoutmaster Conference
8. Board of Review

#### Eagle Rank Requirements

1. Active Life Scout for at least 6 months.
2. Demonstrate Scout spirit by living the Scout Oath and Scout Law in your everyday life.
3. Earn 10 more Merit Badges ~ 6 must be from Eagle required list.
4. While a Life Scout, serve your Troop for 6+ months in a position of responsibility.
5. While a Life Scout, plan, develop, and lead a community service project.
6. Scoutmaster Conference
7. Eagle Scout Board of Review
